# Your Efforts Are Bringing Hope to Life at the Centre for Surgical Innovation

The Centre for Surgical Innovation (CSI), housed within the Kleysen Institute for Advanced Medicine at HSC, is a key focus of the Health Sciences Centre Foundation's fundraising efforts and a part of Manitoba's health care system we should all be extremely proud of. And it only exists thanks to the generosity of donors.

The CSI is a place that beams with hope, as health care teams utilize the unique technology inside to perform advanced surgeries that save lives, and in some cases prevent additional surgeries - which speeds up the recovery process for patients. Treatment spans many areas of care including brain tumours, epilepsy, spinal cord injury, strokes and aneurysms.

One of only seven such configurations in the world, and the first of its kind in Canada, the CSI is also a place where researchers are able to learn about new ways to improve care even further, in areas including concussions, traumatic brain injury and multiple sclerosis.

"The Centre for Surgical Innovation has had a huge impact on the care patients receive at HSC, and it's all thanks to the support we receive from individual donors and community-minded organizations," said Jonathon Lyon, President & CEO of the HSC Foundation. "The surgical teams at HSC tell us what a tremendous difference the Centre makes on their ability to do their jobs effectively, and the result is safer, better care for our loved ones."

The Centre for Surgical Innovation has already performed more than 4,100 advanced surgical procedures and 24,600 imaging procedures for patients.

Since its unveiling in 2013, the CSI has already performed more than 4,100 advanced surgical procedures and 24,600 imaging procedures for patients. It's a place that truly brings hope to life through new standards of care and support for patients in our community.

# From Silent Suffering to Outspoken Advocate

MEGAN LINTON AND THE HSC ADULT EATING DISORDERS CLINIC

MENTAL ILLNESS DOES NOT DISCRIMINATE. AT THE AGE OF 12, MEGAN LINTON BEGAN TO STRUGGLE WITH ANOREXIA NERVOSA. SHE SUFFERED IN SILENCE OVER THE NEXT 7 YEARS, COVERING UP HER CONDITION WITH INTENSIVE ATHLETIC TRAINING. AS A COMPETITIVE ATHLETE, SPORTS WERE THE PERFECT COVER FOR HER CONDITION.

Due to the stigma often attached to mental illness, Megan never felt comfortable reaching out for treatment. So she continued hiding this part of her life eventually graduating with honours from St. Mary's Academy. She received a full athletic scholarship for rowing at the University of Oklahoma.

Shortly after her arrival, Megan slipped several disks in her back during training which brought her rowing career to an end. She remained in Oklahoma for the rest of the year plunging her into a deep depression that almost claimed her life.

Megan's parents, Mona and Mike, immediately brought Megan back to Winnipeg. Megan got a referral to the HSC Adult Eating Disorders clinic and soon began the intensive three-month treatment program. Diagnosed with anorexia, Megan struggled with a great degree of shame but knew she needed to get help.

Eating disorders are often perceived as failures on the part of the individual due to vanity and selfishness. However, the reality is that illnesses such as anorexia nervosa and bulimia are linked to anxiety, self esteem, body consciousness and confidence issues - issues that are tackled head on at the HSC Adult Eating Disorders Clinic.

The Clinic is highly regarded as one of the best programs across Canada. Nutrition is just one of the parts of the program, which includes life skills, cognitive behavioral therapy, art therapy, coping skills, and recreation skills.

Through a daily 8-hour regimen, patients are encouraged to address the psychological issues that underpin their eating disorders, and work towards developing a sense of wellness instead of punishing themselves for wrongly perceived failures.

Mona Linton, Megan's mom, remembers how thorough and exhausting the treatment was. With weekly goals, outings, meal requirements, and the emotional drain of recovering from an illness that had impacted her daughter for nearly ten years.

Megan and her parents believe the recreation program played a key role in bringing Megan back to health. The recreation program relies strongly on private funding for the ability to go on outings, practice food shopping, and explore the world outside the confines of their group therapy room.

The amazing team of nurses, social workers and dieticians, prompted her father, Mike Linton, to encourage his workplace, Dufresne Furniture, to make a donation toward the program so others could benefit. The Dufresne Foundation generously made a \$50,000 gift to the HSC Foundation, designated to the Adult Eating Disorder Program with a focus on the recreation program.

Today, Megan is healthy and alive. A full time student at the University of Winnipeg, she works part time, and is an advocate for mental health awareness. Megan will continue to receive outpatient treatment because both Megan and the HSC Clinic believe that wellness is more than a one-time decision, it's a life commitment.

# 2015 Research Grant Projects Have Breakthrough Potential

## 2015 GENERAL OPERATING GRANTS

\$70,000 to Pingzhao Hu, Charles Bernstein, and Elizabeth Spriggs to identify novel genetic risk factors of inflammatory bowel disease (IBD). If any risk factors are identified, they can be used to improve diagnostics of IBD patients in Manitoba.

\$69,455 to Magimairajan Issai Vanan and Donald Miller to determine if a specific peptide, known as HAV peptide, will help adenanthin cross the protective wall covering the brain. If successful, it will be tested if adenanthin can then block a particular protein, which causes poor treatment response in children with medulloblastoma, from entering the brain.

\$70,000 to Man (Ann) Yi to study new nanomedicine techniques to engineer a targeted treatment of a model bronchopulmonary dysplasia-pulmonary hypertension, with the goal of creating a new tool to reduce and prevent illness or death for infants with this chronic lung disease and its complications.

## 2015 ALLIED HEALTH GRANTS

\$19,998 to Paul Barrette and Teresa Figley to enable pre-surgical brain-mapping with functional MRI at HSC, so as to offer a non-invasive procedure for locating areas of the brain essential for cognitive function (speech, language comprehension, etc.) prior to surgery for tumour removal. This would allow surgical teams to leave those crucial areas of the brain intact.

\$8,536 to Bronwyn Fontaine, Cynthia Puttaert, Ashley Struthers, and Sunita Bayyavarapu Bapuji to study the impact of the MORE (Mood Disorders Occupational Therapy Rehabilitation and Education) service on clients, identify strengths of the service, and determine ways to develop the service to better meet the needs of clients.

\$15,235 to Tanya Kozera, Michelle Horkoff, Kristy Wittmeier, Tidimogo Gaamangwe, Jessica Hartley, and Kathy Vagianos to determine current research capacity in Allied Health at HSC and to use findings to guide research capacity building for individuals and teams.

## 2015 DOLLY & MICHAEL GEMBEY NURSING GRANT

\$1,896 to Jannell Plouffe, Shelley Probizanski, Shelley Irvine Day, Louise Helbig, and Evelyn Casey to implement a patient-engagement program to encourage and increase staff compliance with hand hygiene, and to educate patients about the importance of proper hand hygiene. Hand hygiene is one of the most important ways to prevent the spread of infections.

## 2015 MINDEL & TOM OLENICK RESEARCH AWARD IN IMMUNOLOGY

A \$10,500 award to Qingdong Guan who is studying the powerful immune regulatory cells, known as mesenchymal stromal cells, in patients with multiple sclerosis and determining their potential ability to shut down inflammation and repair tissue within patients.



THE HSC FOUNDATION WAS PLEASED TO PROVIDE MORE THAN \$265,000 IN GRANTS TO 24 RESEARCHERS CONDUCTING EIGHT NEW RESEARCH PROJECTS IN 2015. AWARDING THESE GRANTS IS ONLY POSSIBLE THANKS TO DONORS. THE PROJECTS WERE SELECTED FROM PEER-REVIEWED RESEARCH APPLICATIONS AND CHOSEN BASED ON SCIENTIFIC MERIT, IMPACT ON PATIENT CARE IN MANITOBA, AND ALIGNMENT WITH STRATEGIC PRIORITIES OF HSC WINNIPEG. THESE RESEARCH PROJECTS COULD POTENTIALLY LEAD TO IMPROVED DIAGNOSIS, TREATMENTS, MEDICINES, OR CARE METHODOLOGY FOR PATIENTS AND FOCUS ON AREAS OF CARE INCLUDING DIAGNOSTICS, MENTAL HEALTH, IMMUNOLOGY, AND SURGERY.

Multiple sclerosis (MS) is a debilitating chronic inflammatory disease with Manitobans suffering one of the highest rates in the world. It is estimated 100,000 Canadians are living with this disease, and in the province there are over 340 cases for every 100,000 Manitobans.



Drugs that are currently used to treat MS are imperfect and come with side effects. Part of Qingdong Guan's research into bone marrow derived mesenchymal stem/stromal cell (MSC) infusions could lead to improved treatments for MS patients, and other diseases too.

It starts with 4 teaspoons of bone marrow, and the cells are grown in culture flasks until a high enough number of MSC is manufactured. MSC have had some success in clinical trials, when used to treat several diseases including autoimmune diseases. This success is attributed to their ability to shut down inflammation, and possibly repair damaged tissue.

But we don't know enough about these cells or the best way to work with them to get the most out of this treatment possible. And that is where Guan and his team step in. By studying the MSC used in a clinical trial for the treatment of MS, and finding out whether infusion of the cells into patients will slow or stop the disease, Guan and his team are developing strategies to optimize these cells to work better. This will not only help to further our understanding of how MSC work and how this treatment improves the symptoms of MS patients, but could also help to instruct treatment in other diseases too.



# Donor Generosity Gives Rise to Opening of \$1M Integrated Operating Rooms





ON MAY 20, 2015 THE HEALTH SCIENCES CENTRE FOUNDATION CELEBRATED THE OPENING OF FOUR NEW INTEGRATED OPERATING ROOMS AT HSC WINNIPEG. THESE OPERATING ROOMS WILL IMPROVE PATIENT SAFETY AND EFFICIENCY IN HSC WINNIPEG'S SURGICAL PROGRAM, WHILE INCREASING EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS AND STAFF.

The upgrades were made possible by \$1 million in generous donations to the HSC Foundation from Paul Challoner; the Riley family; James W. Burns, O.C., O.M.; and Brian and Ruth Hastings on behalf of Qualico.

“Performing surgery successfully is a team effort, and we have world-class surgical teams here at HSC Winnipeg,” said Dr. Perry Gray, HSC’s Vice-President and Chief Medical Officer. “With these upgrades, we can provide an even better experience for our patients, improve training for health care providers and showcase the skills and talents of our surgical teams safely to other professionals who visit HSC Winnipeg.”

At the official opening, Dr. Tom McGregor, a surgeon at HSC Winnipeg explained that an integrated operating room includes equipment that communicates together and high-definition cameras and monitor systems that improve real-time information available to the surgical teams. He demonstrated how the video system can be used to help teach other practitioners and showcase HSC’s excellence locally and abroad.

Stacey Kuhl, a nurse educator at HSC Winnipeg described how the signal from the HD cameras is also connected to a designated classroom in the hospital where she can teach both working and new health care practitioners by viewing live feeds of an operation – making it easier to see what is going on, and a safer environment for the patient with fewer people in the operating room.

# The Legacy of Felicya Cheterbok

Born Felicya Warszycka in 1927 in the small village of Niemirow in Poland, she lived the life of a young carefree girl until war struck. Felicya had hoped to learn oil painting from her uncle Stanislaw but he perished at the start of the war in 1939. Two years later, a Nazi bomb fell on her grandmother's house in the forest. Felicya, then aged 14, clearly remembered having to collect her bones, and years later recalled the horror of having to bury her babcia.

Further away a young man, a musician, Wacław Saciuk, did what he could to survive, ultimately ending up in a Soviet prison for 18 months. After the war, Felicya met Wacław, fell in love and became Felicya Saciuk in 1946. Soon afterwards came three wonderful babies: Julie, Christina, and Stanley.

With a view to building a fresh life in a truly democratic country, the family emigrated to Canada, arriving in Winnipeg in 1959. It was here that Felicya and Wacław were blessed

with their fourth child Halyna. Felicya found work as a cleaner, and Wacław as a porter at what was then the Winnipeg General Hospital (now HSC Winnipeg). Their adult children today recall their parents often working all hours of the day to make enough to put food on the table.

One year after arriving in Canada, tragedy struck again when Wacław suffered a heart attack, was treated in the hospital where he worked, and died there in 1960 at the young age of 45. Felicya was now alone, a widow with four young children to feed. She worked tirelessly as a cook to keep her family united together.

In 1974, Felicya married Andrew Cheterbok and settled in Calgary, enjoying happy times together until Andrew died in 1981. Felicya found joy in her children, animals, gardening and her own oil paintings of the Canadian Rockies, that she would freely give to friends and family.

In 2003, Saciuk family history nearly repeated itself, when Felicya's oldest daughter suffered a heart attack due to hereditary cardiac disease in her mid-50s. But there was a different outcome this time, thanks to decades of heart and stroke research. Julie's life was saved and she is happy and healthy today because of the current knowledge and expertise of health care practitioners, and new life-saving technology.

As Felicya neared the end of her own life, a widow on a pension, she did not have abundant financial means. But when she passed away in 2015 she still found a way to leave a lasting impact. In her Will Felicya left a gift to heart and stroke research at the HSC Foundation in memory of her first beloved husband Wacław, and to appreciate the role

research played in saving her daughter Julie's life. Further, she knew that investing in more research could lead to even more advances in medicine, benefitting many families like her own for years to come.

All of the children are grateful that their father is honoured at the HSC through their mother's legacy gift, and proud that their mother led by example and chose to make a difference in the lives of other Manitoba families with one of her last wishes.

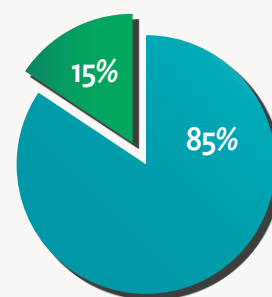

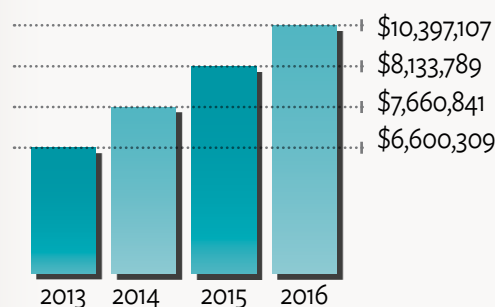

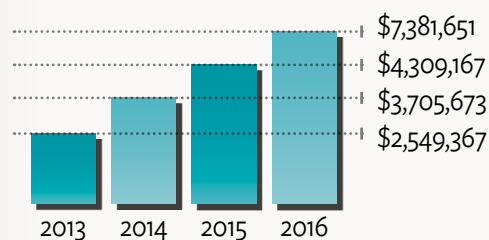
