Year at a Glance: 2024/2025

The fiscal year ending March 31, 2025, was a period of growth and progress marked by record-setting events, the introduction of new surgical technology, and the celebration of a major clinical milestone in thoracic care. Thanks to our donors and corporate partners, the HSC Foundation continues to invest in timely and impactful equipment and initiatives to improve care for all Manitobans and people from Nunavut and Northwestern Ontario who rely on the services of HSC. We thank our donors, partners, and stakeholders throughout the health care system for aligning with us for another year of innovation and excellence.

Here are a few HSC Foundation highlights from 2024/2025:

We generated gross revenues exceeding \$28 million while achieving a new milestone of over \$110 million in assets. We have been experiencing many years of strong fundraising results, financial stability, and a growing impact on the delivery of health care in Manitoba.

In 2024, we launched a process to refresh our strategic plan to guide the Foundation's efforts for the next five years and beyond. The previous strategic plan led to the development of the Foundation's generational Operation Excellence campaign, which has been instrumental in acquiring new minimally invasive surgical equipment.



In June 2024, we celebrated **the appointment of Tina Jones, C.M., O.M., as a Member of the Order of Canada**. Jones, whose ten-year tenure as the HSC Foundation's Board Chair came to a close in June 2025, is one of more than 7,600 Canadians named to the Order since it was established in 1967 to honour people who make extraordinary contributions to the country. Tina Jones's contribution to the success of the HSC Foundation and her impact on health care in Manitoba will be felt for many years to come.

In June 2024, we welcomed **Jarrett Bishop, Tara Kroeker, Danny Menard, and Doug Stephen** to our Board of Directors. We are grateful for their contributions to date and look forward to their continued service.

Our Manitoba Health Care Payroll 50-50 continued to perform extremely well. At March 31, 2025, we had **over 6,000 subscribers** and a **jackpot of over \$100,000**. From inception to March 31, the 50-50 had generated over \$1.2 million in net proceeds, a figure that will continue to grow.



Our lotteries remain an essential revenue-generating activity for us. The Tri-Hospital Dream Lottery, conducted in partnership with the Children's Hospital Foundation of Manitoba and the St. Boniface Hospital Foundation, concluded in July 2024. Net revenue for the HSC Foundation was over \$673,000. In November, our annual HSC Millionaire Lottery wrapped up, generating **over \$2.5 million in net revenue**.



Our 19th-annual Innovation HSC Radiothon, presented by Maric Homes, took place on January 17, 2025. **Donors contributed \$319,002—an HSC Foundation Radiothon record**—in support of patient care at HSC. This included support for the acquisition of life-saving medical equipment that will transform care at HSC Women's hospital. See page 12 for more details.

In September 2024, HSC deployed the da Vinci Xi surgical robot—**Manitoba's first surgical robot**. The robot was made possible thanks to the generosity of donors to the Foundation's Operation Excellence campaign. The robot has been used in thoracic, urologic, and gynecologic surgery to date. Because of the minimally invasive nature of robotic surgery, patients are experiencing less pain, less blood loss, and are being discharged to return to their regular routines much sooner than they would be with conventional open surgery.



In January 2025, we celebrated the **fifth anniversary of the Wilf Taillieu Thoracic Surgery Clinic and Endoscopy Unit**. The clinic has been nothing short of a major success story, offering outstanding patient outcomes and important operational efficiencies through a commitment to surgical innovation and minimally invasive techniques. On March 31, 2025, our annual Innovation HSC campaign surpassed its fundraising target, generating **\$2,896,949 in donor support**. Since its inception, Innovation HSC has raised over \$17 million.

On February 22, 2025, Manitobans came together to support HSC during Savour New Zealand: Wine & Food Experience, presented by Garcea Group of Companies. We attracted a sold-out crowd and raised over \$1 million (a Savour record!). Our Fund-A-Need auction that night was particularly successful as we raised designated funds to help acquire **new equipment for HSC's Adult Emergency Department**. See page 13 for more details.

Operation Excellence Corporate Challenge inspires Manitoba companies

When Rick G. Duha was 11 years old, he helped out part-time in the family's business. His job was to screw together fan decks of colour samples—the kind a customer might see at the hardware store when choosing paint colours.

“Even as a kid, I thought there must be a better way!” laughs Duha, Chief Business Officer at Duha Group, a Manitoba manufacturer of colour marketing tools. “Times have certainly changed since then.”

Duha Group—like so many Manitoba companies—has invested heavily over the years in automation, robotics, and other new technology to improve products, services, the staff experience, and customer satisfaction.

“If you want to excel, you need to have the right equipment. You have to keep pace,” says Duha. “It’s true in business and it’s true in health care. So when we learned about Operation Excellence and the Corporate Challenge, we were eager to step forward. We want Manitoba to have world-class care.”

The HSC Foundation launched the Corporate Challenge in 2024 as a special initiative of the Operation Excellence campaign. To date, the initiative has raised over \$3.5 million.

“Manitoba business leaders are passionate, innovative, and famously generous,” says HSC Foundation Chair Katie Hall Hursh, who co-chairs the Corporate Challenge with Ray Bouchard. “As Operation Excellence evolved, we knew that business leaders would align with our vision of surgical excellence and innovation, as well as our focus on acquiring new technology and attracting and retaining the best talent.

“Rallying businesses together helps us take bigger swings and achieve ever greater objectives for the benefit of Manitobans,” adds Hursh. “The campaign has enticed our donors to give as individuals, to give as corporations, and to give generously.”

As impressed and excited as Duha is by the technology the HSC Foundation is funding, he recognizes that it is people who are truly at the heart of health care excellence.

“Our family has been touched by the remarkable care provided by HSC. My grandmother, in particular, received compassionate and dignified care,” he says. “We are grateful and we’re proud to invest in the future of care. We want our professionals to have the tools they need to do their best work.” ◇

Collaboration is the Key

Celebrating alignment and empowerment



Dr. Christodoulou, Interim President & Chief Executive Officer of Shared Health: “I see the impact every day in our new clinics, in our operating rooms, and throughout the hospital.”

Every time Dr. Chris Christodoulou hears the story of a patient discharged the day after surgery, instead of having to stay a week; every time he hears about a fast, life-saving diagnosis in the Emergency Department; and every time he learns of a positive patient journey in HSC’s new Pain Clinic, he thinks of the HSC Foundation and its donors. And he is grateful.

Dr. Christodoulou, Interim President & Chief Executive Officer of Shared Health and a veteran anesthesiologist, has for years had a front-row seat to the role of the Foundation and its donors.

“I see the impact every day in our new clinics, in our operating rooms, and throughout the hospital,” says Dr. Christodoulou. “Thanks to the Foundation, we are enhancing the quality of care, improving access to timely care, and acquiring new diagnostic and surgical equipment that is as good as anywhere else on the planet. Donors should know that.”

He cites the da Vinci surgical robot, funded by the Foundation’s Operation Excellence campaign; new point-of-care ultrasound equipment for the Emergency Department, funded by donors to the Foundation’s annual “Fund-A-Need” campaign; and the expanded Pain Clinic, relocated to the Manitoba Clinic building which was purchased by the Foundation, as key recent examples of how the Foundation’s activities align with the goals of the provincial government, Shared Health, and HSC.

“Every gift a donor makes to the HSC Foundation achieves a specific outcome that elevates care as a whole in Manitoba,” says Dr. Christodoulou. “HSC is our provincial hospital—it’s Manitoba’s hospital—so any

advancements we can make there have a positive impact everywhere else.”

Shared Health—the province’s coordinating health care body—works with all Manitoba health authorities to plan and implement a coordinated, provincial approach to health services. It is legislated to operate HSC and develop the province’s strategic plan for health care. It is through that lens that Dr. Christodoulou has been participating in the Foundation’s own strategic planning process.

“The Foundation is in sync with our needs in Manitoba and is deeply committed to making sure that the campaigns they undertake will make a tangible difference for Manitobans,” says Dr. Christodoulou. “They achieve this by working closely with Shared Health; collaborating with Dr. Shawn Young (HSC’s Chief Operating Officer) and other hospital leaders; and by making a compelling and inspiring case to donors.”

The support, says Dr. Christodoulou, empowers health care professionals to do their best work and inspires health system leaders to dream big when it comes to improving performance, reducing surgical wait times, and achieving new levels of overall excellence and innovation.

“Our job is to reward that generosity by bringing projects online quickly, producing better outcomes, and attracting and retaining the best talent available,” he says. “We know it drives philanthropic desire when you see the results of your gift take shape and have an impact. When philanthropic action bears fruit, we can plant even more seeds for the future. This is why alignment throughout the system is so important.” ◇

RESEARCHER SPOTLIGHT: Kaihim Wong

Understanding and Predicting Brain Changes in Multiple Sclerosis Using Advanced MRI and Machine Learning

For nearly four years, Kaihim Wong has been working to understand how advanced quantitative magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) techniques can help clinicians offer better care to their patients with multiple sclerosis (MS).

"Regular MRI scans only give us a basic picture of the damage that might have occurred in the brain of an MS patient," says Wong, who is working toward his PhD in Medical Physics under the supervision of Dr. Chase Figley. "The advanced techniques we are exploring can detect more subtle brain changes over time and help predict the disease's progression."

With a better understanding of the prognosis and more insights into what to anticipate, Wong adds, "clinicians can provide more personalized treatment, earlier. The information can help them stay ahead of white matter lesion evolution and other aspects of the disease."

With the support of the grant he has received, Wong will combine a number of advanced MRI measures and use machine learning—a form of artificial intelligence—to build a model to predict how brain lesions might grow or change. He will also seek to understand whether areas around lesions can enhance the technology's predictive ability.

While the research and the technology fascinate Wong, it is the potential impact on patients that keeps him motivated.

"MS can be a difficult disease to treat, so the more information we have, the bigger the difference clinicians can make," he says.

For Wong, the grant funded by the HSC Foundation is also all about making a difference. "The support is a vote of confidence in the work, and I am grateful," says Wong. ◇



In the 2024/2025 fiscal year, the HSC Foundation made several public announcements about important health care progress enabled by the generosity of donors and brought to life through the aligned actions of stakeholders throughout the health care system. Over the year, we celebrated moments in time, and these moments have led to remarkable patient outcomes ever since.

In **April 2024**, the Province of Manitoba announced a new provincial spine program supported by new technology funded by HSC Foundation donors.

In **April 2024**, along with our partners from the Province of Manitoba and Transplant Manitoba, we shared the outstanding news that 2023 had been a record year for kidney transplants in Manitoba. Eighty-three Manitobans received a kidney transplant through the Adult Kidney Transplant Program at HSC in 2023 (the previous high was 77); and 30 kidneys were donated posthumously (the previous record was 22). The increased number of donations was made possible by the HSC Foundation donor-funded HSC Transplant Wellness Centre, which opened in July 2020.

In **October 2024**, we celebrated the appointment of Prof. Frederick Zeiler as the Inaugural MPI Chair in Neurosciences. Dr. Zeiler has developed non-invasive monitoring technology that offers continuous blood flow mapping in the brain. His ongoing research will have a



meaningful impact on the 400+ patients seen at HSC every year for traumatic brain injuries. The Chair was funded by HSC Foundation donors, University of Manitoba donors, and Manitoba Public Insurance.





The HSC Foundation raised more than \$1 million at Savour New Zealand: Wine & Food Experience, presented by Garcea Group of Companies in **February 2025**. Funds raised through the gala's Fund-A-Need auction were used to purchase critical medical equipment for HSC's Adult Emergency Department, including a specialized bedside monitor that assess CPR effectiveness in real-time, portable ultrasound.



In **January 2025**, the HSC Foundation released a donor impact report, outlining the successes achieved by the donor-funded Wilf Taillieu Thoracic Surgery Clinic and Endoscopy Unit since its opening in July 2019.

"By investing in the Taillieu Clinic we have reduced the strain on operating room availability, reduced the number of visits patients are required to make to HSC, and shortened hospital stays," said Jonathon Lyon, the HSC Foundation's President & CEO. "Additionally, the investments we have made with the support of our donors have been integral to attracting and retaining surgeons and other medical personnel. Simply put, the Wilf Taillieu Thoracic Surgery Clinic and Endoscopy Unit is a shining example of how philanthropy drives innovation at HSC and shapes the future of health care."



HSC personnel use the da Vinci Xi surgical robot. "The robot is a shining example of how new technology can help us achieve our goals to end surgical wait times," says Jonathon Lyon.

While not formally unveiled until **April 2025**, the da Vinci Xi surgical robot system—funded by donors to the Foundation's Operation Excellence campaign—was deployed in September 2024. To date, this minimally invasive surgical machine has been used for thoracic, urologic, and gynecologic surgeries—mostly cancers. The state-of-the-art equipment is allowing for less blood loss, less pain, faster recoveries, and shorter hospital stays.

"The da Vinci Xi, in essence, extends the capabilities of a surgeon's hands and a surgeon's eyes. The robot's arms move better and with more stability than is possible for human hands; and the enhanced scopes and visualization technology helps us see even the smallest parts of the anatomy with extreme clarity," said Dr. Edward Buchel, Surgery Site Director, HSC, and Provincial Specialty Lead, Surgery, Shared Health. "The robot is a game changer for our patients and our recruitment efforts. We're grateful for the investments made by the HSC Foundation, the donors to the Operation Excellence campaign, and the Province of Manitoba."




The Health Care Payroll 50/50, coordinated by the HSC Foundation, has generated over **\$1.5 million in net revenue** for the Foundation since inception.

An excerpt from the Bannatyne Legacy Circle story of Jean Lang

...By 2012, Lang started to plan her “exit strategy” with an eye to retirement in 2014. Working with a financial advisor, Lang decided to make sure that charitable giving was part of the plan and ultimately decided to support the Health Sciences Centre Foundation, thereby joining the Bannatyne Legacy Circle. The gift to the Foundation will come from an insurance policy that Lang’s father bought for her when she was young. “It seemed like giving back to where it all started was the right thing to do,” she says. “It was full circle.”

Her decision was reinforced by her family’s many experiences with the hospital.
